



Primary Care Report

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Data Notes:

GP appointments data is classified as "Experimental Statistics". Data is collected from GP systems which are designed for practices to use in everyday work and not for the purpose of data analysis. There are no national standards for data entry about activity and there is widespread variation in approach to appointment management between practices. This means that there are variations in data quality between practices.

The secondary care activity numbers and costs come from SUS – the NHS secondary uses service – as submitted by secondary care providers. The costs applied are those calculated under the NHS Payment by Results (PbR) system which is used as a national currency across the NHS, this will not be fully reflective of the actual cost of the activity as some providers are paid under locally arranged financial agreements. The costs therefore should be considered indicative and for comparative purposes only.

Activity data goes up to July 2020 currently, all comparisons are showing April, May, June and July 2020 vs the same period in 2019.

GP referral numbers are a proxy measure based on all GP referred outpatient first attendances (whether attended or not), we are working to source consistent reliable referral numbers from secondary care, once available we will use this rather than a proxy.

Rates are calculated using the GP weighted population - Carr-Hill formula (which uses factors such as deprivation, rurality, age, additional needs, cost of living etc.) rather than the actual GP list size, the Carr-Hill formula is used for national calculations around practice workload.













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Executive Summary

This Primary Care Report details some key measures in Primary Care and shows variation in secondary care activity across the Primary Care Networks and GP Practices.

Population

North Yorkshire CCG has a lower proportion of patients under the age of 20 than the national average, but a higher proportion of over 65s.

Only 8 out of 51 GP Practices have a deprivation score higher than the national average (higher = more deprived). 19% of the CCG population are registered at these 8 practices.

Patient Satisfaction

Latest Friends & Family figures (February 2020) show that 93% of patients would recommend their GP service to a friend or member of their family. This is compared to a national figure of 90% The GP Survey (July 2020) shows favourable responses for North Yorkshire CCG compared with national figures. 89% of patients reported that their experience at their GP Practice was either Very Good or Fairly Good. This is compared with 82% nationally.

CQC

98% of GP practices in North Yorkshire have a CQC rating of Outstanding or Good

Workforce

North Yorkshire CCG has 66.7 GP WTEs for every 100,000 registered patients compared with a figure of 54.9 nationally. The CCG also has a higher number of Nurse WTEs per 100,000 registered patients with 35.7 compared with 27.2 nationally.

Disease Prevalence

QOF 2018/19 figures show that the CCG has a higher prevalence of Stroke/TIA, Coronary Heart Disease, COPD, Cancer and Dementa than the national average. The prevalence is lower than national figures for Diabetes.

GP Appointments

The impact of coronavirus has seen GP appointments fall by 24% in the first three months of 2020/21 compared with last year. This is comparable with national rates. Face-To-Face appointments have fallen by 47% and Non Face-To-Face appointments have increased by 130%. National levels have seen more of a reduction in Face-To-Face appointments though and more of an increase in Non Face-To-Face.

Secondary Care Activity

The coronavirus pandemic has had a significant impact on secondary care activity. The first 2 months of 2020/21 have seen a sharp drop in activity in most services. The year on year changes between 2019/20 and 2020/21 are:





Disease Prevalence








First to Follow Up Outpatient Ratio

includes OP Procs and NFTF




Outpatient First Appointments * - Activity & Cost


Outpatient Follow Up Appointments * - Activity & Cost






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
Outpatient Procedure Appointments - Activity & Cost







Outpatient Non Face-to-Face Appointments - Activity & Cost







Emergency Admissions - Activity & Cost
