

NYCC Public Health update to NY CCG**November 2020**

This update, requested by the NY CCG Primary Care Co-Commissioning Committee, outlines the activities of the local public health team. It focuses on our current priorities of managing COVID-19 and aligned health protection efforts, work to deliver commissioned services in new ways as well as intelligence support to Population Health Management and recovery planning.

Other long-term work areas have been paused or slowed whilst we have prioritised responding to COVID-19. These will be reinvigorated over the coming months. These range across all aspects of public health including school readiness, mental wellbeing and suicide prevention, workplace health, place shaping and economic regeneration.

COVID-19 management

Work continues to tackle COVID-19 in line with the North Yorkshire COVID-19 Action Plan:

- Care settings: NYCC continues to contact all care homes across NY on a daily basis, providing information, guidance and support on key issues such as infection prevention and PPE. We hold daily multi-agency meetings at Silver and Gold level to discuss care settings with cases and outbreaks, and provide strategic guidance on a range of issues such as discharge arrangements and care homes visiting.
- Education settings: Schools report all cases of COVID-19 to NYCC, who provide support around isolation of staff/students and infection prevention advice. We also provide information and guidance through webinars, CYPs newsletters etc.
- High risk settings: we provide support to workplaces, accommodation settings (e.g. refuges, hostels) and hospitality, leisure and tourism businesses. This involves both prevention advice (including range of guidance published on NYCC website) and specific advice to settings with cases/outbreaks.
- Events: we work with local Safety Advisory Groups around planned events to make sure they are appropriately risk assessed for COVID-19. We have produced guidance on 10 key areas for compliance, and developed a three level escalation process for events of concern (culminating in legal action to close under Coronavirus legislation if there is a significant enough risk).
- With LRF partners we continue to support with regular testing across the county. We continue to direct Mobile Testing Units to each district, with flexibility to target areas of highest concern. We also have 2 Local Test Sites operating on a daily basis in Harrogate and Scarborough, with more planned for Selby, Skipton and Northallerton. We have a stock of swabs at Satellite Test Sites in Scarborough and Harrogate that we can direct to support suspected outbreaks, and we are investigating how we might be able to make use of the new rapid testing capacity (Lateral Flow Tests).

- Since 5th November NYCC has been running a local contact tracing service to support national Test and Trace with any cases that they are unable to complete. We continue to develop this service to enable us to add the most value locally.
- We are participating in wider discussion on COVID vaccination with NHS and other colleagues. Through the Local Resilience Forum (LRF) we have set up a working group to pick up this issue across all parts of the county.
- We continue to work with local Community Support Organisations to provide support in communities. With the second lockdown we will also do further work on contacting Clinically Extremely Vulnerable individuals where necessary.
- We continue to hold monthly meetings of the Outbreak Management Advisory Board with key local leaders. We also hold twice-daily internal meetings to discuss key issues – the 3pm meeting involves a range of partners. Work with partners includes a very significant amount of communications to a wide range of audiences, support to enforcement measures with police and district councils as well as system resilience and recovery.

Flu vaccination

- Ongoing promotion of flu vaccine for health and social care staff through briefings, webinars and training flu champions
- Latest data suggests 31% uptake of care home staff (target is 100%)
- All care homes have been asked for feedback on this year's flu programme. The main issues are around accessing the vaccine due to national shortages. Some staff are still reluctant to have the vaccine due to myths around flu and also concerns that it will make them more susceptible to COVID-19. Ongoing messages have been disseminated to dispel these myths.
- For NYCC staff, pharmacy led drop ins have been provided as well as allowing staff to pay for the vaccine privately and reclaiming this back through expenses. However, shortages have led to some drop-ins being cancelled and most pharmacies are not offering private vaccinations.
- We have been working closely with PHE, NHSE and the CCG to explore whether GPs could vaccinate frontline social care staff who are outside of the national programme but this is not possible. As a result, we are now waiting for further supplies to come through in pharmacies.

Public Health Commissioned Services

Public Health have produced a briefing document to provide updates on the various services that are commissioned by the team, and how these have varied throughout the Covid-19 outbreak (e.g. if providing face-to-face or online/remote support). The document covers services such as drug and alcohol, sexual health, weight management, stop smoking, Warm and Well, NHS Health Checks, and 0-19 services, as well as primary care and locality service provision updates. The newly updated document is here, and will be disseminated in November to GP practices and CCG contacts:

Public Health Intelligence

We have prioritised supporting the three local Primary Care Networks (PCNs) who are taking part in the NHS England Population Health Management programme. We have completed PCN profiles and shared those with each network. In order to inform recovery planning we have profiles for each CCG (NY CCG draft attached) and district council locality, as well as Joint Strategic Needs Assessment deep dives on mental health, learning disability and autism in development.

1. Service updates and current provision - General

0-19 Health Visiting and School Nursing Services - provided by Harrogate District NHS Foundation Trust

Update regarding the 5th November National Lockdown

The lockdown from 5th November will not affect the delivery of any current 0-19 services. Practitioners will continue to prioritise seeing families, children and young people in their own homes, or in school.

A Covid Risk Assessment will be carried out ahead of every home contact and virtual appointment.

If a family is Covid positive or symptomatic then all visits other than the Primary Visit will be deferred for 2 weeks.

In respect to community delivery for the 0-5 years all child health clinics, drop-ins and breastfeeding groups have ceased and this will continue to be the case. All ante natal and new birth contacts are now face to face. These contacts will include a Family Health Needs assessment that includes the Home Environment Assessment Tool. The Health Visitor will initiate Infant Feeding Support and any follow up support required will be provided by a skill mix team. In addition, all 6-8 week reviews are also now face to face.

In respect to community delivery for 5-19, all community contacts, drop-ins, and groups have ceased and this will continue to be the case. A duty phone rota is in place and WhatsApp service is being used as method of maintaining contact with families. The National Child Measurement Programme will re-start in early 2021.

All safeguarding contacts are face-to-face again, as are visits to families on the Vulnerability Pathways. Review Health Assessments are undertaken on a virtual basis or a face to face contact where clinically indicated. Welfare calls are undertaken as required or at a minimum every 3 months, and the service continues to take part virtually in multi-agency and safeguarding processes.

All other contacts are being assessed and stratified for vulnerability or clinical need. There also continues to be a duty phone service and digital signposting is taking place through text, email and using social media. Young People's Service - Compass REACH

In light of the current situation, Compass REACH will be offering virtual appointments to service users in the first instance, however, face-to-face appointments may still go ahead under certain exceptional circumstances and subject to being able to identify a suitably safe venue which can support social distancing.

Referrals are still being received and processed by the team. The Team also continue to be virtually engaged in local multi-agency and safeguarding meetings.

YorSexualHealth (YSH)

YSH continue to provide a high quality service and have undergone a phased return to the full range of provision. The service priorities remain the delivery of the central booking line, online and postal provision of sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment, free condoms and contraception. As restrictions have eased, YSH have been expanding their service provision accordingly. They have re-introduced face-to-face services in as safe a manner as possible.

North Yorkshire residents are, understandably, not able to be seen without first talking to the central booking team. To be able to arrange a discussion, and for confirmation of all support in place in clinics across the county, YSH can be contacted on 01904 721111 (9am - 3pm) Monday to Friday. If the issue is URGENT e.g. emergency contraception, HIV post-exposure treatment or new and significant symptoms, people are advised to let the booking team know. The 'contact us' option on the website can be used but there may be some delays in responding to non-urgent queries.

If someone is under 18 and/or are living in a situation where they are unable to safely call, they can text on 07980 973337. A reply will be received within 1 - 2 working days. Please note that this texting service is not for routine enquiries. If safety is at risk, please contact the police.

Clinics - YSH are currently operating clinics in York, Selby, Harrogate, Scarborough, Northallerton, Catterick, Skipton and Ripon - all other community clinics are suspended.

ALL patients, visitors and staff are required to wear a mask or face covering in all NHS buildings. If you do not have your own face covering YSH can provide a mask when attending pre-arranged appointments.

The YorSexualHealth website www.yorsexualhealth.org.uk/ has all the latest updates on service access and online provision available across North Yorkshire.

Virtual support remains in place for counselling and HIV support services until further notice.

Condoms are FREE to order online via the YorSexualHealth website: <https://www.yorsexualhealth.org.uk/order-condoms/> The age restriction has been lifted and condoms can be posted to residents of any age in North Yorkshire.

All GP practices can be contacted to discuss any concerns about new or existing contraception methods.

Emergency contraception is a priority service; free provision is available remotely with local collection. The nearest participating [pharmacy](#) can be contacted directly or North Yorkshire residents can call YorSexualHealth 01904 721111 or GP.

North Yorkshire Horizons – Drug and Alcohol Service

Horizons has continued to operate a clinically critical service across all 5 hubs since March. Face to face appointments and drop in harm reduction interventions were available where appropriate and necessary. Other assessments, appointments and groups have been delivered by telephone and digital means.

The service reviewed their COVID-secure risk assessment arrangements across all 5 hubs in July, overseen by their lead provider, Humankind. They have continued to review and update these regularly since then. The service adaptations that are described below, implemented from July, remain in place and are subject to ongoing review in line with Government policy and guidance.

Face to face appointments were expanded on a strictly appointment only basis for those identified as having greatest clinical and/ or risk based need. Harm reduction drop in continued to be available. Psychosocial support was still available via telephone and / or digital means (where required). Horizons is reinforcing symptomatic, social distancing and test and trace messages and have updated their website accordingly, and they have issued social media posts.

Horizons prescribers have re-visited the treatment plan of every client receiving opiate substitute therapy (OST – e.g. methadone, buprenorphine) utilising a risk matrix system. They did the same at the start of lockdown. This has allowed Horizons to take a uniform approach to assessing risks for each individual client and to determine the level of prescribing, dispensing and where appropriate supervised consumption required for each client as restrictions ease. Service users seen in general practice (GP) settings have undergone a similar approach to this and have been re-assessed to review appropriate treatment plans. Changes to treatment plans have been discussed on an individual basis with every service user and communicated with their GP where relevant, and their pharmacy.

A drug and alcohol treatment system business continuity plan was approved in April 2020 by North Yorkshire County Council, Horizons, the Local Medical Committee (YorLMC), Community Pharmacy North Yorkshire and North Yorkshire CCG. The plan was updated in July and is regularly reviewed to ensure that it reflects system pressures and meets needs.

Horizons will continue to work with partners across the system to meet needs as safely as possible – this includes but is not limited to children’s safeguarding; Prisons and Probation; homeless hostels and associated co-ordination arrangements; GPs, community pharmacies and community safety hubs.

Living Well Smokefree (LWSF) Community Stop Smoking Service

Smoking has been recognised by the Chief Medical Officer and Health Secretary as a cause of increased risk for coronavirus, as smokers are at greater risk of:

- getting acute respiratory infections
- the infection lasting longer
- the infection being more serious than it would be for someone who does not smoke

The North Yorkshire Stop Smoking Service, Living Well Smokefree is still operational, providing a 12-week package of telephone support with a specialist advisor and facilitating access to stop smoking medications through local pharmacy and GP provision. To refer clients please call: 01609 797272.

North Yorkshire Adult Weight Management Service (tier 2)

In line with national guidance, the Adult Weight Management Service had ceased face-to-face delivery of any element of the service for clients currently accessing the service however the service is still open for business using a virtual offer and accepting referrals. Providers are working with all clients who need support to re-engage with the service again and managing new referrals onto their virtual programmes.

The remote offer will now be the default offer for the services as further service developments are made in the coming months.

All existing clients and new clients will receive a triage assessment and options of service offered will be discussed individually with each client.

2. Service Updates and Current Provision – Primary care

Pharmacies:

Emergency Hormonal Contraception (EHC)

Emergency contraception is a priority service; free provision is available in participating pharmacies or remotely with local collection. The nearest participating [pharmacy](#) can be contacted directly or North Yorkshire residents can call YorSexualHealth 01904 721111 or their GP. All pharmacies follow the FSRH and BASHH guidelines on remote access to EHC.

Supervised consumption

There may be clinically exceptional circumstances where a Horizons clinician deems it unsafe to issue a 7-day take home prescription for a client who requires opiate substitute therapy. In these exceptional circumstances, the Horizons prescriber will write prescriptions for supervised consumption, but more routinely for more regular collections of medication from Pharmacies – ranging from daily collection to multiple collections per week. A drug and alcohol treatment system business continuity plan sets out the agreed system approach and was approved by North Yorkshire County Council, Horizons, the Local Medical Committee (YorLMC), Community Pharmacy North Yorkshire and North Yorkshire CCG. If you have need to speak with the clinical team or a prescriber, please telephone the SPOC and ask to speak with the clinical administrators (Khadijah Khanum and/ or David Barber) or duty clinician.

Stop Smoking Services

Pharmacies across North Yorkshire are still providing a 12-week package of telephone support with a specialist advisor and facilitating access to stop smoking medications through local pharmacy and GP provision. General practice:

Long Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC)

All GP practices can be contacted to discuss any concerns about new or existing contraception methods. Long Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC) has resumed in general practice where capacity has allowed throughout July, August and September.

Shared care

Practices continue to deliver general practice-based drug treatment with ongoing support from Horizons. Individual arrangements are in place with each practice regarding pre-emptive batching of prescriptions and most patients have been moved to 7-day take home

Stop Smoking Services

GP practices across North Yorkshire are still providing a 12-week package of telephone support with a specialist advisor and facilitating access to stop smoking medications through local pharmacy and GP provision. NHS Health Check Programme

National guidance instructing NHS trusts and community providers to cease delivery of NHS Health Check provision expired on the 31 July 2020, and following further guidance from PHE the delivery of NHS Health Check programme has now resumed across North Yorkshire. The physical clinical test aspect of the service remains as face to face, however alternative delivery methods for follow up may be more appropriate to take into account staff / patient safety, time and resource.
