







When to issue a Steroid Emergency Card

In 2020 NHS Improvement published a National Patient Safety Alert to launch a Steroid Emergency Card to support early recognition and treatment of adrenal crisis in adults. This was in response to a number of incidents where patients had not received their usual steroid medication on admission to hospital and/or had not received appropriate additional steroid therapy for acute illness. All patients on the long term steroids, listed below, should be given a Steroid Emergency Card which they should carry with them and show to the medical team on admission to hospital. Other steroid preparations, when used at licensed doses, do not meet the requirement to issue a steroid emergency card. This guidance has been compiled based on the references below, in conjunction with local clinical leads, to provide practical guidance on when to issue a steroid emergency card.

All adults on doses of steroids, equivalent to or greater than the values shown below, for 4 weeks or longer, must be given a Steroid Emergency Card.

Intra Articular Hydrocortisone, Methylprednisolone, Triamcinolone

A single injection is unlikely to cause permanent adrenal suppression but if a patient has major surgery, trauma or intercurrent illness within 28 days they may be at risk of adrenal insufficiency.

If a patient receives repeated injections, or if they are also taking other steroid therapy, they should be considered at risk.

Steroid emergency cards should be given to all patients receiving Intra Articular steroids. Those having a single dose, and not on other steroids can be advised to discard them after one month
